Hokusai, the 'Old Man Mad about Drawing'

Hokusai's tomb, black and neglected, stands in the Asakusa suburb, among the pines and cherry trees of a monastery garden ; unless Western appreciation has led to its being restored It is inscribed, LOTUS "Tomb of Gwakio Rojin Munji," which means "the old man mad about drawing," a description he applied to himself There is- also on the tomb a poem which, according to Japanese ...
